

Ms. Hahn's Classroom Newsletter

Math

This past week students learned about area using tetrominoes shapes. Tetrominoes are like the pieces in the game Tetris. You can play a free version of Tetris at

https://www.freetetris.org/game.php.

Tetrominoes have an area of 4 square units. Children also created new tetromino shapes using squares and different sized triangles.

Next week the students will continue the geometry unit. They will learn more about the attributes of different shapes.

Art

With the upcoming Harvest Festival, the 3rd and 4th grade students have been hard at work making art pieces that are inspired by the changing seasons and autumn colors. Students have been creating a variety of art pieces both individually and collaboratively. I am greatly looking forward to displaying all of their art for the PCCS community to see.

Writing

This week the students continued their animal research project. Our focus this week was planning the research report. Children learned to start a paragraph with a topic sentence and include supporting details. We also looked at mentor texts to write the introduction paragraph. Next week they will write the first draft of the research paper.

Reading

This week the students listened to the book <u>Butternut Hollow Pond</u> and practiced visualizing. The students read more from the book <u>Chocolate Touch</u>. Next week they will be writing an apology letter to Susan or John's mom while pretending to be John. The students will also read more chapters <u>Chocolate</u> <u>Touch</u>.

Illinois Habitats

The students went outside to enjoy the nice weather on Monday. We went to observe and study the wetlands near the soccer field. We discussed different metaphors about the wetlands. Ask your child how a wetland is like a baby cradle or a bar of soap. We also looked closely at a cattail plant to see how it is adapted to live in the wetlands. The students also learned about the beaver and its adaptations for the wetlands. At the end of the week, the students compared the prairie, wetlands, and the forest.

Music

Mark your calendars! The Fall Harvest Festival Concert for grades K-4 is coming up on Wednesday, November 12th! K-4 Students have been preparing American Folk songs and dances in class to get ready for this exciting event. These past few weeks, the 3rd and 4th grades have been staying busy practicing their concert song "Lil' Liza Jane." This song and dance will be featured at the Fall Harvest Festival on November 12th. This song helps reinforce pitch accuracy, steady beat, and instrument playing techniques for the xylophones. These are skills we will continue to work on throughout the year. This past week, we have been working on some fun Halloween books, songs, and instrument parts. Students also got the chance to play a fun Halloween game called "Who is in the Forest on this Halloween Night" using their Piano and Forte voice levels.
