Math

Multiplication was the focus of math this past week. Students have learned that multiplication can be solved with addition and skip counting. They are completing a skip counting book that helps them see the patterns in multiplication. You can help your child with multiplication by practicing skip counting by numbers 2 -12.

Don't forget to study math facts often! Any completed rocket math papers that we sent home, can be kept at home.

Reading

New reading groups began this past week. Students all read an informational article and answered questions about the article. Next week they will read a fiction story related to the informational article.

During independent reading time students read a fiction book and recorded their thoughts on post-its. They will use the post-its next week to complete a reading response.

Social Studies

During social studies this week we focused on woodland Indians. They learned how Indians used deer for their "grocery store". Ask your child to tell you some of the uses of the deer. I also read a few Native American Legends including The Legend of Scarface. The lesson from this story was that what is inside is more important than what is on the outside. Next week we will learn about the Plains Indians.
