## Math

This past week we worked on multi-step problems and breaking apart multiplication problems. The students learned the distributive property of multiplication using array cards. They made equations such as 12 X 7 = (6 X 7) + (6 X 7). This is common core standard <a href="https://docs.org/ccs.nc/lines/ccs.

## Writing

Most students have finished the mineral research paper. Students really enjoyed learning about the minerals and making a Wanted Mineral poster. Next week we will spend time doing short writing assignments that review introductions, conclusions, linking words, and adding details.

## Reading

This week the students began reading <u>Little</u> <u>House on the Prairie</u>. The students will be learning vocabulary words, answering questions, learning different literary elements, and writing about the book. Your child will be required to finish a reading assignment before coming to reading group. There will be time given in class to complete the assignment. 
# **Social Studies and Science**

Due to the early release days and getting ready for conferences, our time for social studies and science was very limited. We will continue learning about pioneers next week.

This past week Naomi taught the class about fossils. She brought a large selection of minerals for the students to examine. The fossil from scat and the petrified wood were the favorites. Next week we will learn more about igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary rocks.
