Math

This past week the students worked on solving multi-step math problems. Students have to do more than one type of math operation to get the answer. Next week we will continue multi-step problems and multiplication.

Writing

This past week the students finished their research about a mineral. Most students have written a first draft of a paragraph describing the mineral. Next week the students will finish the writing assignment. Look for Most Wanted Mineral posters during conferences.

High Frequency Words

Most students have words written in their assignment notebooks. These words are the high frequency words your child missed on a pre-assessment. The students will be quizzed on these words on Monday. Then they will get new words to study in their assignment notebooks.

Computers

In the next few weeks the computer lab and the Chrome books will be used for PARCC testing. All students 4th grade through 8th grade will need a computer for taking the PARCC tests.

Reading

This past week the students listened to Mr. Lincoln's Way by Patricia Polacco for a second time. The students created a foldable about how the character Eugene changed in the book. Next week we will continue to use Patricia Polacco books for reading lessons.

This past week all students read about minerals in our science book about rocks, soil, and minerals. Very soon students will begin reading a fiction book set during the 1800's.

Social Studies and Science

This past week the students learned about pioneer chores, clothing, and food. We also role played coming to a pioneer school. The students recited a poem in front of the class.

The students were excited to examine minerals during science. They had 8 minerals that they looked at the following properties: hardness, luster, streak, color, and magnetism. Next week we will learn about fossils.
