# Math

This past week the students learned about grams and kilograms. The students were given a 1 kilogram of pinto beans and told to figure out how many grams are in a kilogram. The students came close to 1000 grams. They also solve story problems about grams and kilograms. Next week the students will learn about reading a graph. They with reading line graphs and weather. You could help your child by looking up different weather graphs and taking about how to read them.

# Writing

This past week the students listened to a variety of tall tales including Paul Bunyan and Mike Fink. The students then started to plan their own tall tale. Next week the students will work on writing the tall tale.

# Reading

The students are still reading <u>Little House on</u> <u>the Prairie</u>. The students are learning vocabulary words, answering questions, learning different literary elements, and writing about the book. Your child will be required to finish a reading assignment before coming to reading group. There will be time given in class to complete the assignment. However, some students may need to complete the assignment for homework. Please check the website for the current assignments.

# **Social Studies**

Next week the students will continue to learn more about how Illinois became a state. We will learn a little about the Revolutionary War. Next year we will learn even more about the 13 colonies and the Revolutionary War.

The students also spent time finishing labeling the map of the USA with states, capitals, and a few other features.

## Word Work

The students got new words are Friday. Sometimes students will repeat a list for more practice. This is very common in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade. Please remind your child to study and sort the words every night.

# Gardening

The students have cleared out the old prairie grass from our classroom garden. Next week the students will be working on the raised beds. The students will be tilling up the soil with trowels. I do have some gardening gloves for the students, but they can bring their own from home also.
