This letter is about your child's reading level. Recently your child was given a reading assessment called Fountas and Pinnell. During this assessment the teacher listens to your child read a book for accuracy and fluency. After the child reads the book, comprehension questions are asked. Based on the accuracy scores and comprehension scores, students were assigned a reading level. Students at the end of 3rd grade are expected to be at the instructional level P/Q. Instructional level is the level students can read with some support.
