When you complete this project, you will not only learn more about your explorer's life, but you will also be able to teach your classmates about it, too!

Step 2: Research & Get Your Information & Get Your Information

In order to learn more about your explorer and write your report, you must do RESEARCH and find out LOTS of information! In Step 3, you'll complete a "Works Cited" page, listing the sources you used.

Think of this as your prewriting step of the writing process. Make sure you get enough information about your explorer to write a detailed report!

*Remember, your information MUST be in YOUR OWN WORDS and cannot be directly copied from a book or website....don't PLAGIARIZE.

Step 3: Works Cited

A "Works Cited" page goes at the end of your research report. This is where you keep track of the sources you used and it gives credit to the books and websites. If you don't cite your sources, it's called PLAGIARISM, which is like stealing someone else's words and ideas. Authors give us permission to use their books and websites, but we have to give them credit.

On a new piece of paper, write "Works Cited" at the top and underneath, list the sources (websites, books, etc.) that you used to find your information. This should be the last page of your report. *Works Cited sample continued on the next page. Books and websites must be cited differently.

Follow this format for your "Works Cited" page.

Step 4: Write Rough Copy

You're done collecting your research & now it's time to write your actual report! Use the research in your completed boxes to write the rough copy of your research report. This is like the drafting, rough copy part of the writing process. Make sure you organize your info in a logical way that makes sense. For example, don't just put fun trivial info at the end of your report because it's in the last research box. Where does it best fit in your report? You may decide to use headings in your report to organize your information, like a textbook does.

^{*}This is the hardest & longest part of the assignment!

Step 5: Revise & Edit Rough Copy

Check over your rough copy very CAREFULLY!! Remember that your classmates and Ms. Osborne will be learning from your report. Your sentences must be complete, words must be spelled correctly, and your information must be accurate. You must present your information in a logical order that makes sense to the reader. Think of this as the revising and editing stages of the writing process.

Step 6: Write Final Copy of Research Report Research Report

Think of this as the final stage of the writing process. You will type your report. Don't use fancy fonts and sizes because they're hard to read! Make sure it looks nice! Use the rubric on the next page to check that you have followed ALL directions and that your assignment is complete!

Step 7: Finishing Touches Finishing Touches

Now for the fun part! You will need a cover page for your research report with a picture of your explorer. Be creative with your cover page! Make it look nice!

The cover page should include:

- your name
- due date
- subject
- picture of explorer
- a title

Also, before handing in your explorer report, make sure it is organized in the following order:

- 1) cover page
- 2) research report
- 3) works cited page
- 4) this packet
