News from Mrs. Barnett's Classroom January 10, 2020



Weekly Highlights

Happy New Year!! We hope that you had a wonderful break!

Spelling/Daily 5- We finished up our spelling sorts from before break and then did a mid year spelling assessment. Students will continue to work on different spelling patterns to help them become stronger spellers. In Daily 5 we focused on identifying the beginning, middle and end of stories. I introduced an anchor chart for them to use when talking about their books and telling the BME parts. Beginning- who are the characters and what is the setting, Middle- what is the problem and how is it being solved, End- how did the characters change from the beginning and what was the solution.

Writing- This week we came up with interesting names for our chapters and created Table of Contents pages for our chapter books. Later in the week we learned how to add comparisons in our writing and pictures.

Social Studies- Our focus for the week was on **unlimited wants** and **limited resources**, making choices when buying goods and services and why people save money to buy goods and services in the future. We read the stories "Something Good" by Robert Munsch and "Alexander Who Used to Be Rich Last Sunday" by Judith Viorst. These are things that you can talk about with your child as you go to the grocery store.

Natural Leader- On Friday we came up with the idea of having our own system of nominating Natural Leader students in our classroom. The kids worked together in teams to identify what a Natural Leader does and is. We will use these ideas and create a ballot. Students will then get to use these ballots to nominate their peers throughout the week and on Friday we will choose a Natural Leader from the week. The kids are really excited about this new addition to our weekly routine and we are hoping for it to help us continue to build a positive community in our classroom.

Math Highlights

This week we finished Unit 4 Module 4 and next week we will move on to Unit 5. Students learned about Rockhopper Penguins and King Penguins. Students started with a warm-up activity involving combinations of 100. They compared their height to the height of the Rockhopper Penguin and King Penguin and later in the week compared the penguins heights. In Number Corner we worked on solving subtraction problems involving situations of comparing, with unknowns in all positions and solving for the unknown in an addition equation involving 2 whole numbers.

Math Vocabulary- compare, graph, height, inch, measure, data, strategies **Math Homework**- through p 68 and IXL for 10 min
