#### Parents,

What a week it has been! I think it is safe to say that everyone is looking forward to having a few days to relax and de-stress after a long first week of remote learning. Thank you so much for your patience and understanding this week as we worked out the technology kinks, took some time to get to know you and your child, and helped the students acclimate to Zoom.

Here is some important information as we move into our second week of school:

#### Seesaw

In Kindergarten, we use a program called Seesaw, which is a platform for student engagement. Teachers can empower students to create, reflect, share, and collaborate. Students "show what they know" using photos, videos, drawings, text, PDFs, and links. It's simple to get student work in one place and share with families, and nothing is shared without teacher approval.

Once you are on the platform, your child will be able to post pictures of their finished assignments so that teachers can see how they are doing. We will also be able to quickly share links, schedules, and other information with you through this

We'd like you to share the video with us on either Seesaw or via email by **next** Wednesday (8/26). Over the next few weeks, we will play these short videos during our meeting times so that the kids can get to know each other better!

### **EE** (Environmental Education)

Next Tuesday (Thursday) Ms. Naomi will be coming for our second EE lesson at 10:45 am. If it is possible, we would like your child to be able to go outside during this lesson. Ms. Naomi will be asking the children to find different things in nature and to bring them back inside to the computer to show off. As we know this is not feasible for every child, another option could be to have your child look out the window to find each item and then draw a picture to hold up to the screen. If neither of these options work, your child could still participate by talking and drawing about a time when he or she saw one of the items being looked for. If your child will not be able to go outside during this time, please just have some blank paper and crayons/markers available for them to participate in an alternative way.
